Across all school divisions within the district, the total potential loss of federal funding is approximately \$195,989,923, which could result in the loss of about 1,094 educator jobs and vital student services.



This table summarizes federal K-12 funding at risk across each school division in the district. It includes cuts to Title I, IDEA, USDA, other instructional programs like teacher training and English learner support, and total federal K-12 funding and educator jobs at risk. It also includes the share of students enrolled in Medicaid - a critical source of funding for school-based health and support services now also under threat.
